### School Street Poster Competition

We are launching a poster design competition to allow us to include children's artwork on the signs that will be used on lamp post to promote the School Street Scheme in Commerell Street. The winner will have their design made into a sign post for a lamppost.

A4 should be used and designs should cover the whole page, we are looking for big, bold and colourful artwork - avoiding adding too much detail, simple designs work best. Pupils can use pencil, crayons or pens.

The brief for the designs is express, through art, why a School Street is a good idea.

#### Example of focus could be:

- To encourage / enjoy more regular walking, scooting and cycling to school
  - To encourage less driving
  - To encourage families that 'have to' drive to park further away from the school and walk the last part of the journey (Park & Walk)

#### Examples of 'why's':

- Walking is sociable, you can catch up with family friends on route
  - Provides exercise / physical activity
  - Good for your heart, bones and muscles
  - Better air quality / cleaner air / less pollution
  - Road Safety - Safer for children / pedestrians
