Try this at home:

Make your own playdough

Ingredients:

250g plain flour

50g salt

140ml water

1 to 2 tablespoons cooking oil





A few drops of food colouring (optional)



Recipe:


1. Measure the flour and salt and pour into a large mixing bowl.
2. Add the water and oil
3. Knead well until the mixture is smooth – you might need to add a bit more flour or water to ensure the consistency is not sticky.
4. Add food colouring (optional)
5. Store in a plastic bag (or container) in the fridge until chilled enough to use.
6. Store in an airtight container to use again.
