



<b>Subject</b>	<p>Read the story - <b>About forgiving</b> (see below).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>How do you think Peter felt when he heard what Jesus had to say?</li> <li>How do you feel?</li> <li>How do you make up with others after something has gone wrong?</li> </ul> <p>Think about the questions above, and discuss them with your family.</p> <p>Talk about forgiving - what do I need to do when someone has hurt me? Recall a time when this has happened to you, make a story board about it (draw it like a comic strip).</p> <p>Can you see any links between your story and the story of Jesus? What are they?</p>	<p>Look back at last week's photograph of the caterpillars in the tree (see below).</p> <p>Think carefully about how they begin their life, and what happens from there until they die, can you draw a diagram to show this?</p> <p>Read the information text below <b>and/or</b> look at this video which shows the life of a caterpillar and also shows the life cycle at the end.  <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=O1S8WzwlPIM">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=O1S8WzwlPIM</a></p> <p>Create the life cycle of a butterfly - an example (of a frog) can be seen here:</p> 	<p>To link with our Maths and Science learning, create a symmetrical butterfly painting or artwork.  <i>Using paint is easier but you could create using pens, tissue paper or any other arts and crafts materials.</i></p> <p><b>Instructions</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Take a piece of card, fold it in half down the middle, so it's like a book.</li> <li>Open the card, squeeze some paint onto <b>one side</b> of the card (don't put it on both sides)</li> <li>Don't be too careful - make sure you put all the colours you want on to the card. Fold the card back in half, and press down - this will help to transfer the paint from one side to the other, creating a symmetrical mirror image.</li> <li>Open up the card once again, leave to dry.</li> <li>Once the pain has refold it, and cut wing shapes around the edges.</li> <li>Add some black card to the middle to create the butterfly body or you can leave it as is.</li> <li>For more info watch this clip <a href="https://tinyurl.com/y894uk5k">https://tinyurl.com/y894uk5k</a></li> </ul> <p align="center">An example of a symmetrical butterfly &gt;&gt;&gt;&gt;</p> 	<p><b>Remember - The Great Fire of London</b></p> <p>Create a timeline of the Great Fire of London using the template below or using a sheet of paper to draw the time line, and write the answers on correctly.</p> <p>Stick on labels by cutting out and sticking on or writing your own.</p>	<p><b>Piece 3 - Calm Me</b></p> <p><b>Vocabulary:</b> Baby Toddler Child Teenager Adult Independent Timeline Freedom Responsibilities</p> <p>Think of a place where you feel calm. Think how you can use your breathing to help you feel calm and positive. Breathe in, feeling your lungs fill up and then gently let the air out so you feel relaxed and peaceful.</p> <p><b>Questions to consider</b></p> <p>What were you like as a baby? How are you different now? How will you be different when you are grown up? Does your mind feel calm and ready to learn?</p> <p><b>Help me reflect</b> Think about something new that you have learnt to do since you were a baby that you are proud of, and b) something you are looking forward to being able/allowed to do as an adult. What's difficult is to help the others, the people who don't like you, the people who don't help you."




# Butterfly Life Cycle

Butterflies have a complete life cycle with four separate stages.



## What happens during the first stage?

The new butterfly starts life as a very small egg on a leaf. Eggs can be round, oval or cylindrical and some are ribbed.



## What happens during the second stage?

A caterpillar (or larva) hatches. They have patterns, stripes or patches and are sometimes hairy. The caterpillar needs to eat lots to grow.



## What happens during the third stage?

The caterpillar forms a chrysalis (or pupa). It is usually brown or green. The caterpillar starts to grow wings.



## What happens during the fourth stage?

It is now an adult and usually learns to fly in 3 or 4 hours. The adults also mate and the female butterflies lay eggs, beginning the life cycle again.

## The Great Fire of London

<p><b>Early Sunday Morning</b> The fire starts at Thomas Farriner's bakery on Pudding Lane.</p>	<p><b>Mid Sunday Morning</b> As news of the fire spreads, people run to escape from its path.</p>	<p><b>Sunday Morning</b> Samuel Pepys starts to record the unfolding events in his diary.</p>
<p><b>Sunday Evening</b> Houses are pulled down in an attempt to stop the fire spreading.</p>	<p><b>Early Monday Morning</b> People carry their possessions to safety using boats on the River Thames.</p>	<p><b>Late Monday Morning</b> Carts are banned from going near the fire.</p>
<p><b>Monday Evening</b> The fire spreads very close to the Tower of London.</p>	<p><b>Tuesday</b> St. Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.</p>	<p><b>Wednesday</b> The fire starts to burn more slowly as the wind dies down.</p>
<p><b>Thursday</b> The fire is finally under control and put out.</p>
