### Dinners

For the first half term on our return to school, all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and those entitled to a free school meal in Year 3 – Year 6 will be provided with a school-made packed lunch.

All other families who require a school-made packed lunch can order and pay for these in the usual way, via our ParentPay system.

If we do not receive a completed form, we will assume that your child/children will be provided with their own packed lunch from home.

### School Uniform

It is the expectation that children will be in full school uniform on a daily basis, as detailed below:

White polo shirt or shirt/blouse  
Green/yellow school tie (must be worn with a shirt, optional with polo shirt)  
Green St Joseph's logo jumper  
Grey trousers/skirt  
Plain black shoes (no trainers)  
Plain socks (preferably grey)  
A green or yellow checked summer uniform dress or grey school shorts may be worn in the summer term

#### PE Kit

White round neck T-shirt  
Plain, dark shorts or dark jogging bottoms  
Black plimsolls for indoors and trainers for outdoors  
Plain socks
