

Subject	<p>Geography <u>Oh I do like to be beside the seaside.</u> Oceans.</p> <p>There are five oceans in the world. Together they cover more than 70 per cent of our planet, and they are all connected together.</p> <p>Complete the task below, labelling the 5 main oceans of the world:</p> <p>the Atlantic Ocean the Pacific Ocean the Indian Ocean the Southern Ocean the Arctic Ocean.</p> <p>This video from BBC Bitesize can support your learning.</p>	<p>Science <u>Forces and Magnets.</u> Friction.</p> <p>Friction is a force between two surfaces that are sliding, or trying to slide, across each other. For example, when you try to push a book along the floor, friction makes this difficult. Friction always works in the opposite direction to the direction in which the object is moving, or trying to move. Geography

The nearest ocean to the UK is the **Atlantic Ocean**. It is sometimes label "North Atlantic" and "South Atlantic." It stretches from Europe and Africa to North and South America, and is the second largest of the five oceans. The biggest ocean is the **Pacific** and is shown in two halves on this map. The **Southern Ocean** and **Arctic Ocean** surround the poles. The **Indian Ocean** is south of India. Even though there are 5 oceans, there are 7 labels. Using this information, label the oceans onto the map.




Science
