

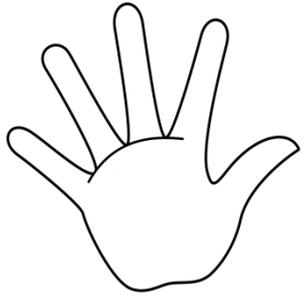

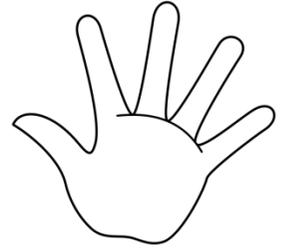

<p>Understanding of the World – RE</p> <p>We have been looking at God’s Wonderful World.</p> <p>Last week we looked at pictures of people sharing God’s world and thought of ways we could look after God’s world.</p> <p>This week we are going to think about why it is important to share God’s world. 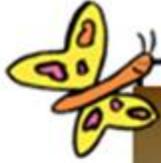


This week you are challenged to...

Understanding of the World - Science

Ingredients

- Pineapple
- Apples
- Strawberries
- Bananas
- Watermelon
- Or your favourite fruit

Equipment

- Chopping boards
- Sharp knife (adult use)
- Knives
- Star-shaped cookie cutter (optional)
- Wooden kebab skewers

Method

1. Before the activity, prepare the wooden skewers by boiling them in hot water. This will stop them from splintering.
2. Wash the fruit.
3. Ask an adult to remove the skin from pineapple, watermelon and apple (optional).
4. Peel the banana.
5. Cut the apple, pineapple and banana into chunks, and the strawberries into halves.
6. Cut the watermelon into slices.
7. Use the star cookie cutter to cut star shapes out of the watermelon slices.
8. Lay out the fruit and start to place on the skewers (this could be done in a pattern).
9. A star-shaped piece of watermelon can be the final piece of fruit placed onto the top of the skewer to finish the magic wand fruit kebab.
